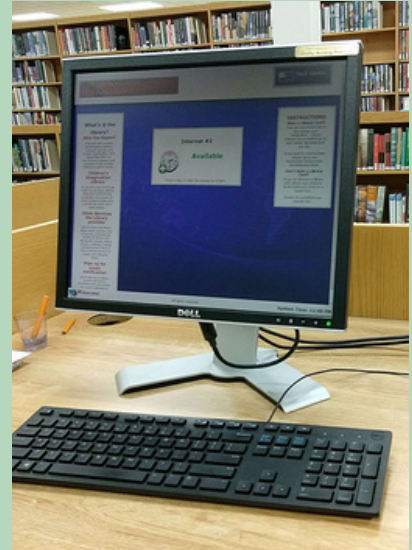
Coming in April: National Poetry Month

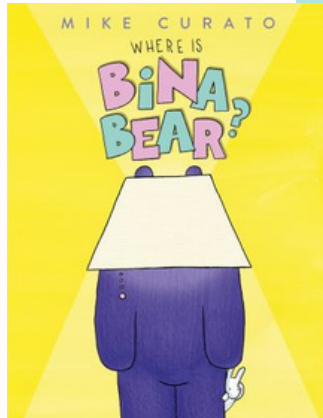

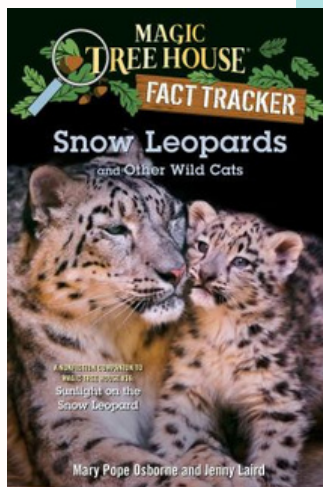

by Mike Curato

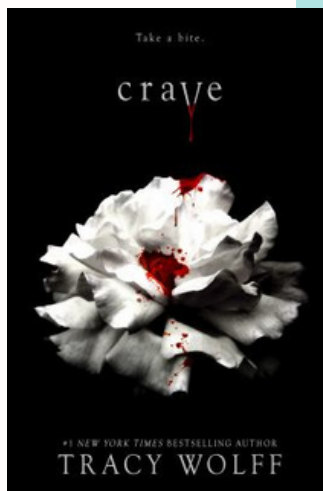
A humorous yet sincere picture book about friendship, understanding, and embracing our loved ones just as they are.

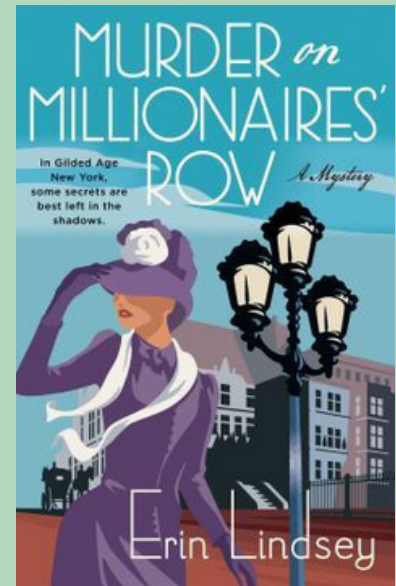
