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I Love You Because I Love You



The second title in the charming early chapter book series, *Cornbread & Poppy*, by Caldecott Medalist Matthew Cordell is a story about two friends who learn to appreciate each other's differences. A great choice for emerging readers!



*I'm A Virus!* by Bridget Heos

A cute and informative title about viruses for youngsters. We learn what viruses are, how they spread, and how our bodies defend us against them. End pages provide more details about white blood cells and vaccines. A gratifying title to mollify curious young minds!



This is a School by John Schu

This book is an endearing celebration of primary school as a diverse, welcoming,

and communal place for discovery. Representation is abundant, as is the notion that learning is a journey instead of a destination. Perfect to share with a class at the start of a new school year!




Answers in the Pages by David Levithan

An important and timely book that weaves together three stories of friendship, courage, and acceptance, all told through the eyes of children. A book for discussion and an incredibly thoughtful perspective on LGBTQ kids, banning books, and what it means to be in community with one another.



Only One by Deborah Hopkinson Beautifully illustrated, the story of our world is made simple and told from a child's perspective. We learn concepts like planets, continents, and species. This book is also a call to care for the only planet we live on. An alluring picture book about our universe and our place in it.



#### Luli and the Language of Tea

by Andrea Wang A delightful read about human connection over cups of tea. A gentle reminder that we all share more in common than we may think. Darling endpapers show tea cups from around the world and an author's note shares her heartfelt inspiration for the book.



#### The Ogress and The Orphans by Kelly Barnhill

A enchanting title about community, generosity, and empathy, and the impact they have in our lives. More importantly, it is a lesson about the dangers of the assumptions we make about those who are different from us. A superb read aloud that will spark much conversation!



*Rewilding* by David A. Steen

This amazing compendium blends facts about animals, ecology, and conservation, as well as the impact humans have had on the natural world. It introduces us to the idea of rewilding as a last attempt to save a species and includes a helpful section on what you can do to protect our planet.
