

2024 Wilsonville Community Garden Rules and Guidelines

Please read and sign, acknowledging your agreement.

Garden plots are limited to one per household in an effort to provide as many gardeners as possible with access to plots. Plots are year-round, and are not tilled in the spring.

If your plot goes unattended/unused throughout the year, and no notification has been given to Wilsonville Parks and Recreation, it will be reassigned. Your plot fee will not be refunded.

Effective in 2024, all gardeners will be required to contribute and log four (4) hours in service to the community garden. ***Please see and complete the Community Garden Service Hour Form.***

- Use common courtesy.
- Do not expand your designated area beyond the limits staked out. Allow adequate space for thinning and spreading crops. Be considerate of your neighbors: Plan ahead so that you do not shade other plots with tall crops. Structures and plants over 6-feet-tall are not allowed.
- All compost must be placed in provided compost bins. Do not create compost piles along the fence line.
- All belongings (including plants) must be kept within your plot. Do not grow plants up the side of the fence, or keep potted plants outside of your plot boundary.
- Wind hoses up and return to the faucet site when finished, do not hang hoses on spigots.
- Closely supervise your children when they are helping at your plot.
- It is your responsibility to maintain your plot, **as well as the surrounding path**. Bark chips and wheelbarrows will be available for gardeners to use.
- Dogs are not allowed inside the fenced area of the garden.
- All Wilsonville parks are smoke and tobacco-free.
- Tires are not allowed at this site.

The community garden is for **organic gardening only**.

- Products not allowed include, but are not limited to: non-organic pesticides and herbicides, synthetic fertilizers, and any other chemicals.

If a gardener abuses the guidelines above, Wilsonville Parks and Recreation will give the individual two (2) weeks from the initial warning to remedy the issue. If the issue is ignored, Wilsonville Parks and Recreation has the right to remedy the issue (removing large structure or plant, etc...) or revoke the individual's garden privileges for the following year.
